6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, over 58% of Vermont adults and nearly 27% of Vermont youth are overweight or obese; and
10 11	WHEREAS, 21% of all U.S. health care costs are spent on obesity-related conditions; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS, estimated annual obesity-related medical costs for the state of Vermont are \$163 million; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, consumption of sugar sweetened beverages has increased 500% in the past fifty years and is now the single largest category of caloric intake in children, surpassing milk in the late 1990s; and
19 20	WHEREAS, sugar sweetened beverages account for at least one-fifth of the weight gained between 1977 and 2007 in the U.S. population; and
21 22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, studies suggest that a 10% price increase for beverages through taxation would decrease consumption by about 8-10%, now therefore be it
25 26 27	RESOLVED that the VMS support a two-cent-per-ounce excise tax on sweetened beverages; and be it further
28 29 30	RESOLVED, that all the revenue be used to provide greater access to health care to low income Vermonters, subsidizing the purchase of healthy foods for low-income Vermonters and funding obesity prevention/education efforts that are evidence-based.
